SUMMARY

According to *Virginia Code § 15.2-2230*, the comprehensive plan must be reviewed by the planning commission once every five years. Since 2013, the Planning Commission Comp Plan Sub-Committee has been reviewing the Page County Comprehensive Plan (Volume I and II). The Planning Commission's public hearing was held on January 28, 2020. The Planning Commission unanimously recommended approval of the amendments to the Page County Board of Supervisors.

On March 3, 2020 the Page County Board of Supervisors agreed to hold a public hearing on Page County Comprehensive Plan Volume I and II at the Board's April 21, 2020 regular meeting, and directed staff to provide adequate notice of such hearing in accordance with the Code of Virginia 15.2-2204.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommendation is that the Page County Board of Supervisors approve the Amendments to the Page County Comprehensive Plan (Volume I and II).

BACKGROUND:

Since 1980, each Virginia locality has been required to have a comprehensive plan. According to *Virginia Code § 15.2-2223*, the local planning commission shall prepare and recommend a comprehensive plan for the physical development of the territory within its jurisdiction and every governing body shall adopt a comprehensive plan for the territory under its jurisdiction. A comprehensive plan is general in nature, and with its accompanying maps, charts, and descriptive information, shows the locality's long-range recommendations for the general development of the territory.

SUMMARY:

Page County Economic Development is submitting a letter of interest to the Virginia Department of Housing and Community Development (DHCD) for grant funding from the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Virginia Funding Opportunities for COVID-19 Response. The purpose of the grant funding is to provide food assistance to the unemployed restaurant and hospitality workforce and masks to the essential and general population in Page County.

Programs to be funded for a short duration of time depending on funds granted:

1. Expansion of temporary “food hub” concept organized by Page County Economic Development to provide support to an important segment of the economy during the COVID-19 crisis. Strategies include:
 - Bring some hospitality jobs back – manage food hub and make masks with this workforce
 - Create less of a burden on local food pantry – allow local food pantry to concentrate their efforts on the increased demand they are receiving from other sectors of the population.
 - Provide food assistance for laid off restaurant and hospitality workers (est. over 300)
 - Keep restaurant workers employed – weekly lunch and dinner meal service contracted with local restaurants
 - Sustain small restaurants and markets – 25% of the food purchased must be from a local farm market
2. Masks produced for essential and general populations

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommendation is to approve a resolution of support for the proposed local need programs funded by the Community Development Block Grant Virginia Funding Opportunities for COVID-19 Response

BACKGROUND:

DHCD is making available current CDBG funding to small cities, towns, and rural counties to respond to local needs related to COVID-19 response.

FISCAL IMPACT:

There is no fiscal impact to the County.

The reimbursement amount for PPTR (Personal Property Tax Relief) that we receive from the Commonwealth of Virginia annually is \$1,640,790.80. This amount was set forth by the Commonwealth and frozen in Tax Year 2007.

This reimbursement amount is given to taxpayers whose vehicles qualify as personal use. Each year the percentage granted to the taxpayers changes due to number of vehicles qualifying, values and tax rate.

The amount for Tax Year 2020 will be 27.5%.

I hereby request that the Board of Supervisors be presented this amount to be approved at the meeting held on today's date. Please note that this percentage is determined by the amount set forth by the Commonwealth and is calculated by the Commissioner of the Revenue's Personal Property Book.

Hello Tina S.,

Based on researching the matter, it appears that (as requested earlier in the year), a part time line was created in the Crime Prevention budget to accommodate Rob Marshall's employ. Line 101-3130-431.11-04. However, that line has no budget allocated to it.

We did, on the other hand, increase the SRO Grant budget to \$100,000 (101-3130-431.59-57) and it's corresponding offset that is including the SRO reimbursement from the school system (101-0000-324.04-45).

Based on the current trend, it looks as if we will exceed the allocated salaries in total if you add together the part-time line and the SRO grant expenditure line.

Recess: Chairman Phenix called for a brief recess before reconvening in open session.

Reconvene: Chairman Phenix reconvened the Board of Supervisors work session at 7:00 p.m., in the Board Room. The Call to Order was followed by a Moment of Silence and the *Pledge of Allegiance*.

Discussion of Proposed Solid Waste Agreement with Rappahannock County:

Nathan Miller, County Attorney, said this agenda item needs to be tabled because the matter is still in negotiation.

Concurring Resolution Regarding a Financing by the Northwestern Community Services Board:

Mike Elwell, Executive Director of Northwestern Community Services, said the Code of Virginia, Section 37.2-504(11) requires the authorization of the City Council and Board of Supervisors of the respective counties before NWCSB may borrow money. Mr. Elwell said NWCSB has been leasing space costing \$17,000 a month, and this loan will allow them to fund an acquisition, construction, renovation, improvement and equipping of property located in Frederick County, Virginia, to be used for an Outpatient Behavioral Health program. This will save over \$4,000 a month to reinvest in services. They plan to borrow up to \$4,000,000 for a bridge loan with BB&T (Truist) and then a permanent loan with the U.S. Department of Agriculture to fund the project. He emphasized that this debt does not transfer to the localities. He also announced they will be relocating their Luray office to leased space on General Drive (former Sentara medical office), Luray, and will offer more services in Page County to include, a walk-in clinic for children and adults, adult mental health, children's mental health, and provide substance abuse services. The Board endorsed the financing plans of the NWCSB through the adoption of the Resolution.

CONCURRING RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF
THE COUNTY OF PAGE, VIRGINIA,
REGARDING A FINANCING BY THE

NORTHWESTERN COMMUNITY SERVICES BOARD

WHEREAS, the Northwestern Community Services Board (the “NWCSB”) was created pursuant to Chapter 5, Title 37.2 of the Code of Virginia (1950), as amended, by resolutions of the Board of Supervisors of the City Council of the City of Winchester, Virginia (the “City”) and Frederick County, Clarke County, Shenandoah County, Page County, and Warren County, Virginia (collectively, the “Counties”); and

WHEREAS, the NWCSB has represented to the County of Page that it desires to borrow up to Four Million Dollars (\$4,000,000) with a bridge loan with BB&T (Truist) to and then a permanent loan with the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) fund, in part, the acquisition, construction, renovation, improvement and equipping of certain property located in Frederick County, Virginia, to be used, for an Outpatient Behavioral Health program and the payment of the financing costs therefore; and

WHEREAS, Virginia Code Section 37.2-504(11) requires the authorization of the City Council of the City and the Board of Supervisors of the respective Counties before the NWCSB may borrow money.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF PAGE COUNTY VIRGINIA, AS FOLLOWS:

1. The County hereby endorses the financing plans of the NWCSB, including a bridge loan with BB&T (Truist) to and then a permanent loan with the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA)
2. To the extent required by law, if at all, the County hereby endorses and further approves any necessary or appropriate actions of the NWCSB to effect such financing.

This Resolution shall be effective immediately.

Motion: Supervisor Vaughan moved to adopt #2020-03 Concurring Resolution for the Board of Supervisors of the County of Page, Virginia, regarding a financing by the Northwestern Community Services Board. Supervisor Louderback seconded and the motion carried by a vote of 6-0. Aye: Phenix, Guzy, Louderback, Stroupe, Foltz, Vaughan. Nay: None.

Radio System Update:

Cheryl Giggetts, CTA Consultants, gave a presentation on the updates received after the initial presentation she gave the Board in January 2020. The County needs an updated public safety radio system to provide reliable coverage and communication to the first responders in time of emergency. The current system has coverage in approximately 60% of the county and the portable radios will meet the end of life this year.

The two proposals received were from L3Harris Technologies and Motorola Solutions. CTA reviewed the updated coverage guarantee provided by L3Harris, updated schedule provided by Motorola, updated pricing of multiband subscribers provided by Motorola, and updated quantity and type of subscriber units provided by user agencies.

L3Harris Proposed System Design:

- 800 MHz P25 Phase 2 Trunked Radio System (Connect to Harrisonburg/Rockingham P25 Core)
- 4 RF Sites (Big Mountain, Kibler Hill, Piney Hill, Tanners Ridge, Jollett (if necessary))
- 4 Channels
- Simulcast
- Microwave Ring (ECC included; Connect to Harrisonburg/Rockingham Microwave Ring)
- Upgrade UHF paging system/Utilize existing pagers

The coverage guarantee from L3Harris was: 90% for mobile, 94% for portable outdoors, and 95% for portable inside light buildings. She noted that if L3Harris is unable to meet these percentages, they will add a site in Jollett, at no cost to the County.

L3Harris Proposed Interoperability:

- 800 MHz (Harrisonburg/Rockingham)
- UHF/VHF/700 MHz/800 MHz (Multi-band radios)
- Interoperability Considerations (Increased communications with other coming into Page County; Confined by your coverage footprint)

Motorola Proposed System Design:

- UHF P25 Phase 2 Trunked Radio System
- 4 RF Sites (Big Mountain, Tanners Ridge, Shenandoah Valley Electric, Jollett)
- 4 Channels
- Simulcast
- Microwave Ring (ECC included; Single Monitored Hot-Standby Spur to Jollett)
- New UHF Paging System/Utilize Existing Pagers

The coverage guarantee from Motorola was: 95% for mobile, 95% for portable outdoors, and 95% for portable inside light buildings.

Motorola Proposed Interoperability:

- UHF/VHF/700 MHz/800 MHz (multi-band radios)
- Interoperability Considerations (Increased communications with others coming into Page County; Confined by your coverage footprint)

Ms. Giggetts reviewed the evaluation criteria with 100 allowed points for technical merit and 43 allowed points for pricing. The new allocation of technical points for L3Harris is 88.81 from 81.33 and 86.85 from 87.26 for Motorola. The allocation of pricing points for L3Harris was 39.28, in the January presentation and is now 38.84, and 40.21 from 41.54

for Motorola. The total allocation of points for L3Harris went from 120.61 to 127.65 and 127.06 from 128.80 for Motorola. The total pricing for L3Harris went from \$9,995,853.02 to \$9,494,654.73 and Motorola was \$9,754,820.17, is now \$9,432,419.14. She reviewed the proposal advantages and negotiation considerations for both companies.

Ms. Giggetts highlighted that the variance between the two proposers' score is less than 1 point. It was the opinion of CTA and the Evaluation Team that either vendor will provide a public safety communications system that will meet the needs of the Page County users. CTA recommended Page County include inputs from the user community in making the final award. Both proposers are holding current pricing until March 31, 2020.

Radio System Contract Award:

Following the Radio System presentation, Mrs. Moler indicated that input was solicited from each stakeholder organization requesting their radio system preference and the reason for their choice. Every organization, except one, chose L3Harris Technologies, mainly for core redundancy, seamless interoperability and radio pricing.

Motion: Supervisor Vaughan moved to award the proposed radio system contract to L3Harris Technologies, with the overall cost of the radio system implementation, including a 15-year maintenance cost of \$9,494,654.73. Supervisor Stroupe seconded and the motion carried by a vote of 4-2. Aye: Louderback, Stroupe, Vaughan, Phenix. Nay: Guzy, Foltz.

Special Entertainment Permit – 2020 Willow Creek East Scout Competition:

Liz Lewis, Economic Development/Tourism Coordinator, explained that a special entertainment permit application was received from Troop 4, Scouts BSA. They are requesting a permit for the 2020 Willow Creek East Scout Competition, which is a 10-station timed Scouts BSA competition emphasizing scout spirit and competition on April 17-19, 2020. The event will be held at Lake Arrowhead, 265 Lake Arrowhead, in Luray. She recommended approving the special entertainment permit.

Motion: Supervisor Guzy moved that the Board of Supervisors approve the Special Entertainment Permit application for the 2020 Willow Creek East Scout Competition, Saturday, April 17, 2020 – Sunday, April 18, 2020. Supervisor Vaughan seconded and the motion carried by a vote of 6-0. Aye: Louderback, Stroupe, Foltz, Vaughan, Phenix, Guzy. Nay: None.

Review of the Draft Comprehensive Plan:

Liz Lewis, Economic Development/Tourism Coordinator, explained that according to Virginia Code Section 15.2-2230, the Comprehensive Plan must be reviewed by the planning commission and governing body once every five years. Since 1980, each Virginia locality has been required to have a comprehensive plan. According to Virginia Code Section 15.2-2223, the local planning commission shall prepare and recommend a

comprehensive plan for the physical development of the territory within its jurisdiction and every governing body shall adopt a comprehensive plan for the territory under its jurisdiction. A comprehensive plan is general in nature, and with its accompanying maps, charts, and descriptive information, shows the locality's long-range recommendations for the general development of the territory.

Since 2013, the Planning Commission Comprehensive Plan Sub-Committee has been reviewing Volumes 1 and 2 of the Plan. The Planning Commission's public hearing was held on January 28, 2020, and unanimously recommended approval of the amendments to the Page County Board of Supervisors as documented.

Motion: Supervisor Vaughan moved that the Page County Board of Supervisors hold a public hearing on Page County Comprehensive Plan Volume 1 and 2 at the Board's April 21, 2020 regular meeting, and direct staff to provide adequate notice of such hearing in accordance with the Code of Virginia Section 15.2-2204. Supervisor Guzy seconded and the motion carried by a vote of 6-0. Aye: Stroupe, Foltz, Vaughan, Phenix, Guzy, Louderback. Nay: None.

Preliminary School Budget Review:

Wendy González, School Superintendent, presented the Superintendent's proposed operational budget for FY21. She reviewed the revenues and noted that the total for FY 2020 was \$39,963,611. The net proposed increase in state funding for FY 2021 is \$1,699,822 while a decrease is proposed for Federal funding at \$24,200, a decrease for recovered costs/other revenue at \$925,400, and a decrease for local funding at \$18,779. The net total projected FY 2021 revenue is \$40,695,054. Next, she reviewed the expenditures. The net expenditures for FY 2021 is \$39,039,048. The additions needed total \$2,246,450, which include \$720,000 for health insurance fringe, \$195,591 for VRS mandated increase, \$470,942 for 2% salary increase, \$148,626 Shenandoah Valley Regional Costs, \$480,000 SOQ requirements, and \$231,291 for other. This would bring the net projected FY 2021 expenditures to \$41,285,498. The net amount needed from the Board would be \$590,444 for their operational budget. She noted that this does not include the needs outlined in their 10-year CIP. She said this is their preliminary budget because the Governor's budget is not finalized so they do not have the final figures yet from the state.

Call to Order:

Chairman Phenix called to order the regular meeting of the Page County Board of Supervisors on March 17, 2020, at 7:00 p.m., in the Board of Supervisors Room located in the Page County Government Center, 103 South Court Street, Luray. The Call to Order was followed by the Invocation given by Micah Griffith and the *Pledge of Allegiance*.

Adoption of the Agenda:

Supervisor Guzy added the following to New Business: Discussion of the Compactor Sites Temporarily Closing, County Readiness for the COVID-19, and Horticulture and Livestock Zoning Ordinance Amendment.

Motion: Supervisor Guzy moved to adopt the agenda, with the additions to New Business. Supervisor Vaughan seconded and the motion carried by a vote of 6-0. Aye: Phenix, Guzy, Louderback, Stroupe, Foltz, Vaughan. Nay: None.

Public Hearings:

Zoning Ordinance Amendments:

EXHIBIT A

Chairman Phenix opened the public hearing on Zoning Ordinance Amendments at 7:04 p.m.

Tracy Clatterback, Zoning Administrator, proposed the following amendments to the Zoning Ordinance:

§ 125-4 (Definitions):

- Amend the current definition of *contractor office*
- Add a definition for *commercial parking facilities*

- Re-define current definition of *commercial workshop* and relocate definition in code

§ 125-9 (Woodland-Conservation):

- Add the use of *commercial parking facilities* by special use permit

§ 125-10 (Agriculture):

- Add the use of *commercial parking facilities* by special use permit

§ 125-13 (Industrial):

- Add the use of *commercial parking facilities* by-right

Regarding the contractor office proposed definition change, staff currently has a business that is in violation of the Zoning Ordinance for having an illegal contractor office in an agriculture zoning district. The business has expressed interest in rezoning to the commercial zoning district where contractor offices are a by-right use.

However, based on the current definition of contractor office, if they apply for the rezoning and it is approved, they would still not be allowed to park their operations' vehicles, equipment, and/or materials on-site. She said this would hinder the operation of the business.

Regarding the commercial parking facilities, she has received numerous inquiries from citizens wanting to potentially start new business ventures. The current zoning ordinance allows for commercial parking facilities in the commercial zoning district only but does not define what is included in commercial parking facility. Adding the proposed definition will add clarity.

The Planning Commission held a public hearing on October 8, 2019. There were no comments from the public regarding the proposed amendments. The Commission voted 9-0 recommending approval, as drafted above to the Board of Supervisors.

Chairman Phenix closed the public hearing on the Zoning Ordinance Amendments at 7:08 p.m.

Public Comments on the Public Hearing:

There were no public comments during the hearing.

Motion: Supervisor Foltz moved that the Page County Board of Supervisors approve the above listed amendments, as presented. Supervisor Stroupe seconded and the motion carried by a vote of 6-0. Aye: Guzy, Louderback, Stroupe, Foltz, Vaughan, Phenix. Nay: None.

Presentations, Proclamations and Awards:

Jail Needs Assessment:

Tony Bell, Moseley Architects, gave a presentation on the Page County Community-Based Corrections Plan Needs Assessment and Facility Planning Study. The purpose of the Community Based Corrections Plan was to analyze the needs and provide a solution for meeting those needs. The needs assessment was to work with the County to clearly define the need and to assess the current system and facility conditions. The facility planning study was to identify options for addressing the need and to provide detailed, valid, reliable planning data and options for addressing incarceration needs of the County Jail. Mr. Bell reviewed the County's demographics, criminal justice trends, inmate population trends, and the existing jail facility. It is estimated that by the year 2029 there will be a population of 316 inmates and based on this a new jail would cost \$54,352,000. However, the state would reimburse 25%, therefore, it is estimated that the cost to Page County would be \$40,764,000. The next step in the process is to identify key sites for selection, evaluation, and development of a new jail.

The Board suggested that staff place the issue of site selection for a new jail facility on an upcoming agenda.

COVID-19 Update from the Health District:

Colin Greene, MD, MPH, Director of the Lord Fairfax Health District, updated the Board on the Coronavirus (COVID-19). He reported there were 67 positive cases in Virginia. The virus is passed by close person-to-person contact, inhaling respiratory droplets from coughs and sneezes, and from surfaces. He reviewed the symptoms and course of the disease noting that persons 60 years old, chronic disease, immune compromised are at the highest risk. People should wash their hands often with soap and water, avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth, cover your sneezes and coughs, avoid crowds, and stay at home if you are sick. Commonly used surfaces should be cleaned and disinfected. He said updates can be found on the Centers for Disease Control website or on the Virginia Department of Health website.

Proclamation – disAbility Awareness Week 2020:

Mrs. Moler said Access Independence has requested that the Board adopt a Proclamation for disability Awareness Week 2020.

PROCLAMATION**

WHEREAS, the United States Congress enacted the Americans with Disabilities Act in 1990, prohibiting discrimination against people with disabilities in employment, public accommodations, transportation and telecommunications; and

WHEREAS, the Commonwealth of Virginia enacted the Virginians with Disabilities Act in 1985 to assure equal opportunity to persons with disabilities in the Commonwealth, and it is the policy of this Commonwealth to encourage and enable persons with disabilities

to participate fully and equally in the social and economic life of the Commonwealth and to engage in remunerative employment; and

WHEREAS, people with disabilities often overcome common misunderstandings about their circumstances and make valuable contributions to their families and communities; and

WHEREAS, disability is a natural part of the human experience, and individuals with disabilities deserve the same rights as their peers to live independently, enjoy self-determination, make choices, contribute to society and participate fully in the American experience; and

WHEREAS, the community plays a central role in enhancing the lives of people with disabilities, and people with disabilities benefit from having a network of supportive friends and family, accommodating employers and community leaders who are aware of these needs and abilities; and

WHEREAS, millions of people in the United States have disabilities and we all must make a conscious effort to discover their functional abilities and to remove the barriers met in their effort to acquire independence; and

WHEREAS, it is the goal of Access Independence, Inc. to involve the community in all aspects of disAbility Awareness Week and establish an atmosphere that supports awareness and education of on-going initiatives to enhance public understanding of, and appreciation for, abilities possessed by those of us who experience life with disabilities.

NOW, THEREFORE the Page County Board of Supervisors hereby proclaims April 20-26, 2020 as Northern Shenandoah Valley disAbility Awareness Week 2020, and call this observation to the attention of all of those people who live in the County to work together to raise awareness and understanding of the abilities of people with disabilities.

Motion: Supervisor Guzy moved to adopt Proclamation #2020-04, as presented. Supervisor Stroupe seconded and the motion carried by a vote of 5-0, with 1 abstention. Aye: Louderback, Stroupe, Vaughan, Phenix, Guzy. Abstain: Foltz. Nay: None.

FY 2021 Budget Presentation:

Mrs. Moler explained that the budget guidance for department heads were no service increases, no new positions or vehicles purchased with general fund dollars, and program expansions were to be fully justified with a funding plan. The instrumental factors in preparing the FY2021 budget were: stabilizing the jail operating budget, increases to social services funding as part of recent state mandates and service needs, VRS biannual increase (9.21%-10.71%), 3% pay raise for employees (partial state match), health insurance 5.6% decrease in current premiums, and reinvestment into capital equipment. She noted that the primary driver of the budget increase is jail operations. The fund balance, she said, has stabilized in recent fiscal years, providing comparatively sure financial footing. In addition, significant budget reductions have taken place since

FY2015. Due to an increase in departmental efficiencies, solid waste is projected to generate \$195,000 in additional revenue next year, while expenditures for operations have gone down nearly \$13,000. EMS revenue recovery funds have demonstrated their efficacy as an offset to EMS staffing, tracking at roughly \$100,000 in additional funding to support career EMS. Children’s Services cost remain steady and Social Services cost sharing has a low increase. Our telecommunications changes resulted in \$20,000 in recurring savings, and capital projects performed at or under budget in FY2020. The fund balance currently stands at 32%, which is the fourth consistent year of fund balance growth. Cash flow has improved considerably, and with several large projects on the horizon, the fund balance stability should aid in maintaining cash flow confidence upon payment of contract milestones. The State and Federal revenues are relatively stable, yet still in decline for the general fund, with a \$133,000 overall decrease primarily from the state. Once again, SRO funding has decreased as well as other law enforcement grants. The NG911 capital projected will be funded fully by the state at over \$200,000. Lastly, Mrs. Moler then reviewed the school funding and requirements and the revenue collection outlook.

After discussion, the Board asked Mr. Click to get some detailed line item information from the schools for the upcoming budget meeting.

Public Comments on Agenda Items:

There were no speakers during Public Comments on Agenda Items.

Action Matters:

Budget Changes:

Dennis Click, Director of Finance, reviewed that the Page County Sheriff’s Department requested \$1,036.64 in state revenues and \$730.30 in federal revenues in asset forfeiture disbursements. Also, the Page County Public Schools requested an appropriation of state funding in the amount of \$8,730 from a school security grant program, and \$26,679.48 related to the Virginia Tiered Systems of Support. He recommended appropriation of \$37,176.42, as outlined.

Motion: Supervisor Guzy moved to approve the appropriation of state and federal funding in the amount of \$37,176.42. Supervisor Stroupe seconded and the motion carried by a vote of 6-0. Aye: Stroupe, Foltz, Vaughan, Phenix, Guzy, Louderback. Nay: None.

Rappahannock County Solid Waste Agreement:

The Rappahannock County Landfill Use Agreement to accept municipal solid waste (MSW) was presented by Jeff Blevins, Landfill Director. The terms are 11 tons per day up to a maximum of 20 tons per day. Rappahannock County will be charged a tipping fee of \$34 per ton for MSW, \$150 per trip, and \$20 per ton for recycling materials processing fee. The term of the agreement is for 10 years.

Motion: Supervisor Guzy moved to approve the Rappahannock County Solid Waste Agreement, as presented. Supervisor Stroupe seconded and the motion carried by a vote of 6-0. Aye: Foltz, Phenix, Guzy, Louderback, Stroupe. Abstain: Vaughan. Nay: None.

Board and Commission Appointments:

Ms. Miller, Assistant County Administrator, reviewed the Board and Commission appointments:

Economic Development Authority:

A vacancy exists on the EDA for District 1. An individual needs to be appointed to fill that seat for an unexpired term through January 31, 2022. A vacancy exists on the EDA for District 3. An appointment is needed for a four-year term through January 31, 2023. A vacancy exists on the EDA for the Town of Shenandoah representative. The Town is aware and is seeking someone to serve. The term would be for a four-year term from February 1, 2020 through January 31, 2024.

No names were given for consideration. The appointments were deferred until the April meeting.

Building Code Appeals Board:

The term of Keith Higgs (District 4) has expired. He is eligible to serve another term, which will expire December 31, 2023.

Motion: Supervisor Foltz moved to appoint Keith Higgs to the Building Code Appeals Board (District 4) for a term that will expire on December 31, 2023. Supervisor Louderback seconded and the motion carried by a vote of 6-0. Aye: Vaughan, Phenix, Guzy, Louderback, Stroupe, Foltz. Nay: none.

Massanutten Regional Library Board:

A vacancy exists on the Massanutten Regional Library Board. An appointment is needed for a three-year term through September 30, 2022.

No names were given for consideration. The appointments were deferred until the April meeting.

Northwestern Community Services Board:

One seat on the Northwestern Community Services Board is currently vacant. An appointment is needed for a term through December 31, 2022.

No name was given for consideration. The appointment was deferred until the April meeting.

Consent Agenda:

Motion: Supervisor Guzy moved to approve the Consent Agenda as follows:

- Financial reports for the periods of February 1-29, 2020;
- Accounts payable checks, payroll checks, payroll direct deposits, and payroll Tax related electronic fund transfers totaling \$1,481,359.55 for the month of February 2020;
- Minutes of February 4, 2020 and February 18, 2020;
- Coyote claims totaling \$100.

Supervisor Vaughan seconded and the motion carried by a vote of 6-0. Aye: Phenix, Guzy, Louderback, Stroupe, Foltz, Vaughan. Nay: None.

Old Business:

There was no Old Business to consider.

New Business:

Temporary Closure of Convenience/Recycling Sites:

The Board discussed the recent temporary closure of the Convenience/Recycling Sites as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic. It was decided that staff would work toward a possible solution to re-opening the sites with other regular employees or hire temporary employees, if possible. Mrs. Moler stressed that the closure is temporary.

COVID-19 Readiness:

The Board ensured that the public will be informed of updates regarding the COVID-19 pandemic.

Zoning Ordinance Amendment:

Supervisor Guzy indicated that the Zoning Ordinance is a mess and there are people who cannot legally have a garden. In addition, they cannot have livestock if they live in a residential zoning district. He said the Board needs to address this immediately.

Supervisor Vaughan stated that in order for it to be done immediately, the ordinance would have to be re-written. Supervisor Guzy indicated that was done and the Board held a public hearing on it. Mrs. Moler stated that the Board wanted to make changes to the draft before adopting. She said they can ask the Berkeley Group to work on that portion of the ordinance re-write first. Further, she indicated that the Board wanted the zoning ordinance re-write done properly and contracted with the Berkeley Group to do so.

Supervisor Guzy indicated that when someone contacts the Zoning Office to inquire about having a garden or livestock, they are informed of the law. Currently, because the way

the ordinance is written, citizens are not allowed to have a garden, raise livestock, grow hemp in a residential zone.

Chairman Phenix stressed that if the Board interferes with adjusting the consultant's work because one person feels their voice is louder it will ruin the work of the Berkeley Group. Mrs. Moler added especially if it pertains to a Board member personally. Supervisor Guzy stated that he was going to have a garden and a horse. At that time, Chairman Phenix called for point of order.

After discussion, it was consensus of the Board to wait on amending this portion of the Zoning Ordinance, until the re-write is complete by the Berkeley Group.

Open Public Comments:

There were no speakers during Open Public Comments.

Administrator's Report:

Mrs. Moler said in the effort to protect our EMS staff they will be wearing more personal protective equipment (PPE), due to the COVID-19 pandemic. She said it was time again to apply to the Virginia Department of Transportation for Smart Scale projects. She asked the Board to let her know if there are any projects they would like to include in the application.

Supervisors Time:

All Supervisors thanked everyone for attending the meeting.

Call to Order:

Chairman Phenix called to order the budget work session of the Page County Board of Supervisors on March 24, 2020, at 7:03 p.m., in the Board of Supervisors Room located in the Page County Government Center, 103 South Court Street, Luray. The Call to Order was followed by a Moment of Silence and the *Pledge of Allegiance*.

Budget Review and Discussion:

Mr. Click began the FY2021 budget review with the master expenditure change list, which included the radio system debt service, 3% raises for employees, 1.5% VRS increase, Line of Duty Act insurance increase, and anticipated revenue from the Rappahannock County solid waste contract. If these changes are approved, it would result in a surplus of \$403,548.25. Next, he reviewed the capital improvement plan items for a total of \$376,728 funded from the fund balance. The Board then discussed the contributions to other agencies. After discussion, it was consensus to give Page One a contribution of \$5,000, with an additional \$3,000 in free waste disposal at the landfill. They agreed to fund the remaining contributions as suggested. The Board discussed the abandoned vehicles at length and how to handle enforcement. It was consensus to hire a part-time Environmental Services Coordinator and task them with this responsibility. Lastly, the Board discussed the school budget and asked for a line item breakdown of their request. Mrs. Moler indicated that this had been requested previously but was not provided. The Board emphasized that they would not approve the budget until they received a line item breakdown from the schools. She said she would make the request again. In addition, given the schools shutdown for the rest of the academic year, due to the coronavirus, the Board said they would like to know where the savings will occur in the school budget.

Motion: Supervisor Guzy moved that the Board of Supervisors advertise for no increase in taxes and to set the budget limits as proposed by staff. Supervisor

Louderback seconded and the motion carried by a vote of 5-0. Aye: Phenix, Guzy, Louderback, Stroupe, Vaughan. Nay: None.

Adjourn: 9:35 p.m.

With no further business, Chairman Phenix adjourned the meeting.
