**ORDINANCE TO AMEND A PORTION OF CHAPTER 105 (TAXATION)
OF THE PAGE COUNTY, VIRGINIA CODE**

WHEREAS, by Ordinance duly adopted, the Board of Supervisors of the County of Page adopted Chapter 105, "Taxation", Article VII, "Exemption for Elderly and Disabled Persons" of the Page County Code, which Chapter has been amended from time to time; and

WHEREAS, such Ordinance is in full force and effect on the date hereof; and

WHEREAS, upon mature consideration, the Board of Supervisors of the County of Page has determined that it is in the best interest of the County to further amend the Chapter.

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved and ordained by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Page, Virginia, that Chapter 105 ("Taxation"), Article VII ("Exemption for Elderly and Disabled Persons") be amended as follows:

1. Chapter 105, Section 22 ("Requirements"), subsection "C" shall be amended to read as follows:

The total combined income received from all sources during the preceding calendar year by owners of the dwelling who use it as their principal residence and owners' relatives who live in the dwelling shall not exceed the median household income for Page County, according to the most recent US Census Bureau report. For purposes of this article, this figure shall be referred to as "median household income". The first \$5,500 of income of any relative who is not the spouse of an owner and who lives in the dwelling shall be excluded from determining the median household income; provided, however, that if such relative can establish to the Commissioner of the Revenue by clear and convincing evidence that they began living in the dwelling for the sole purpose of providing care for the tax relief applicant, then such relative's total income shall be excluded from the calculation of the tax relief applicant's median household income.

2. Chapter 105, Section 27 ("Amount of exemption"), subsection "A" shall be amended as follows:

For qualified persons, the amount of exemption of tax shall be determined by the following table:

Annual Income	Percent of Tax to be Exempted
\$0 to 40% of median household income	100%
41% to 50% of median household income	50%
51% to 60% of median household income	25%
61% to 100% of median household income	0%

3. Except as amended above, Chapter 105, Taxation, remains in full force and effect.

This Ordinance amending Chapter 105, Article VII, Exemption for Elderly and Disabled Persons shall become effective on January 1, 2024.
