2015 Elections:

Drug Take Back Program:

The Page County Sheriff's Office wishes to remind our citizens that they maintain a Drug Take Back secure container at the Sheriff's Office. This is available in the Investigations Division Office, Monday through Friday, from 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. They accept all prescription drugs, no questions asked. No "sharps" or liquids are accepted in the container.

Compactor/Recycling Site Hours:

The Springfield/Shenandoah Compactor/Recycling sites are open Monday through Saturday, from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Only bagged trash and recycling items with designated containers are allowed at the sites. All other items must be brought to Battle Creek Landfill. Battle Creek hours are Monday through Saturday, 8:00 through 4:00 p.m., with commercial and large load cut-off at 3:00 p.m. All commercial waste and recycling must be taken to Battle Creek. Regulations require that the compactor sites be used by citizens from individual households only.

Tax Relief for the Elderly:
